Enter a story with neat writing or typing, and remember—spelling, punctuation, and capitals count! Stories should be sent in a digital format . You may share with Google Drive or you may email your story to Ms. Sandberg at <u>esandberg@ccsd73.ca</u>.

Finalists will be selected by Ms. Sandberg and her panel of judges. Students at our school will vote for the winning story. The winner will receive a \$25.00 gift card from Chapters and a copy of The Steffie, a book published by our school with stories by this year's winners and runner-ups. Runner ups will also receive a copy of the book. Stories are due January 28th, 2021.

Tips: Think about the words you are using for your story and descriptions. Try to write so your reader is able to feel like they can really imagine your story, or feel they are really there. You may choose to do some research to make your story feel more real.

Firstly, on behalf of our staff, I would like to wish all of you a wonderful holiday season. We wish you a safe and happy holiday with time for relaxation with family.



Our first day back in the building after the holidays is Monday, January 11th. School does resume on January 4th, but the week of January 4-8th will be done remotely. Online learning during this week will be different from the online learning last spring. Schools throughout Chinook's Edge School Division will be similar in that they will be providing a more typical day for students following the daily classroom schedule. There will be google meets first thing in the morning and afternoon to take attendance and review the plan for the morning and afternoon. Teachers will be doing mini-lessons to explain content throughout the day and provide assigned tasks. Music and health instruction will be part of the regular schedule.
