You may share with Google Drive or you may email your story to Ms. Sandberg at esandberg@cesd73.ca.

Finalists will be selected by Ms. Sandberg and her panel of judges. Students at our school will vote for the winning story. The winner will receive a \$25.00 gift card from Chapters and a copy of The Steffie, a book published by our school with stories by this year's winners and runner-ups. Runner ups will also receive a copy of the book. Stories are due January 28th, 2022.

**Tips:** Think about the words you are using for your story and descriptions. Try to write so your reader is able to feel like they can really imagine your story, or feel they are really there. You may choose to do some research to make your story feel more real.

A message from the Superintendent

In Chinook's Edge, we know that creating a positive social-emotional culture in our schools will significantly impact the well-being and achievement of both students and staff. We care deeply about this priority and the entire division is engaged in creating SEW supportive classrooms. Social Emotional Well-being (SEW) has been a key divisional goal for us for several years.

Under the direction of Dr. Marcie Perdue, Associate Superintendent of Student Services, Chinook's Edge has developed a series of training sessions for school leaders, teachers and support staff. The focus of these sessions is to promote universal social emotional strategies, such as focusing on the classroom environment and using visuals to support classroom routines. The training also focuses on the importance of developing emotional vocabulary and self-awareness. The strategies are being shared through training to all division staff who work directly with students: teachers, educational assistants and school administrators. A highlight of the training sessions was recognizing key characteristics which capture the most impactful social emotional classroom environment.

This determined focus, to bring social emotional well-being supports to life in every school, will help students and staff reach their full potential. When everyone in our school communities are met each morning knowing they are welcome, safe, cared for and respected, they are more open to learning, leading and succeeding.

#### A Message from the Principal

Firstly, on behalf of our staff, I would like to wish all of you a Happy New Year and all the very best in 2022! We hope you have had a restful Christmas season.

In January, we will once again be very focused on helping all of our students develop their reading and writing skills. The early grades and the elementary years are critically important years as students develop their foundational skills for learning in high school and beyond high school. The literacy skills developed in the early grades are also foundational for success in the world of work. It is very important that students read at home regularly to ensure strong literacy skills. To become great readers, our students need to practice their skills regularly. With our learning disruption funding from the Alberta Government, we have been providing our grade two and three students with extra support to address learning gaps in both reading and mathematics. Towards the end of March, we will begin focusing more on our grade one students. Lastly, just a reminder that regular attendance does make a difference with student learning so attending regularly, whenever possible, will help to minimize or eliminate learning gaps.

During the week of January 17-21st, we will be having a Clay Artist in Residency program in our school. Kindergarten to grade six students will all have the opportunity to complete a painted clay project. Each class will spend a block of time during the week to complete their project. We are excited about this opportunity for our students and we would like to thank our Fundraising Society for funding this residency program.

Lastly, thank you so very much for your help and support as we have navigated this past year. Your words of encouragement and kindness have been so appreciated. Our students have been absolutely amazing in following all the protocols during this challenging time and we are truly grateful.
