Safe & Caring Message:

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Teaching children about respect is a positive life skill that will help them to develop positive relationships throughout their life. Respect can be taught in many ways, but ultimately it's about modeling and encouraging children to treat others the way they want to be treated.

Teaching and modeling respect builds the following skills in children:

- Effective communication skills
- Ability to take responsibility for their own mistakes and learn from them
- Ability to better tolerate the mistakes of others
- Effective listening skills for productive, positive conversations

Ability to better understand differences and meet them with openness and kindness

Our very wise sixth graders had this to share about how they show respect:

Our Top Ways to Show Respect

- 1. We don't steal or snoop.
- 2. We use our social filter when conversing (you need to be thoughtful with jokes and sensitive topics).
- 3. We treat each other with kindness.
 - a. We compliment each other.
 - b. We politely greet one another.
 - c. We help one another when it is needed.
 - d. We include and notice one another.
 - e. We don't make fun of each other or anybody else.
 - f. We don't bully.
 - g. We encourage others to be themselves.
 - h. We lift each other up.
 - i. We are kind.
- We stay out of each other's personal space. We acknowledge and respect 4. others' personal boundaries and privacy.
- 5. We listen actively to others.
 - a. We don't talk over others.
 - b. We solve problems instead of fighting and arguing.
- 6. We honor diversity.
 - a. We accept all people ... no matter what!
- 7. We stand up for each other.
 - a. We don't gossip or spread rumors.
 - b. We don't smack talk.

c. We don't name drop when talking through tough things. That would embarrass our peers.

- 8. We do what is expected of us
 - b. We work hard and hand in assignments on time
- 9. We participate in our classroom and learning!

We hope you have a fantastic April and a Happy Easter!


