\*If your child is late please have them check in at the office.



### Safe and Caring

At Steffie Woima we have a school-wide approach for teaching consistent expectations to our students. We use a learning and problem solving approach to support our students in solving problems that arise.

Helping kids acknowledge and learn from their mistakes requires support from both school and home. Parents and staff at Steffie are partners in growing kids! By teaching kids to take personal accountability and owning their part in problems, we teach them that mistakes happen and we can experience regret for our choices but that when those mistakes happen, it's important to learn to fix or grow from them. This helps to instill moral values of right and wrong, even when there is no one watching.

Our school wide expectations were created based on an understanding that there are key expectations that children need to be able to understand and follow in order to be healthy and successful.

Our expectations at school include:

I keep my hands, feet, and other objects to myself Because...

This keeps everyone safe including me!! There are many ways to solve problems when we are upset and at my school the adults are always willing to help me make a plan.

I Use Kind, clean and courteous language because...

It shows caring about myself and others!
Being kind and polite to others makes them feel comfortable and safe when they are around me. This helps build healthy relationships and friendships.

I listen and follow the directions the 1st time because...

This shows that I am responsible!!

When I listen and follow directions the first time, I am keeping myself and others safe.

I am also making sure that I can learn and do my best. It allows others to learn and do their best as well.

I walk in the hallways & Wear inside shoes inside and wear outside shoes outside because ...

This keeps everyone safe when walking in the hallways! It also takes care of our building and shows that we are proud of our school.

Adults having expectations of me and me working hard to meet them is so important because they will help me to learn and grow. They help me make healthy choices especially as I grow bigger and the adults aren't around. I will be better equipped to know how to make healthy choices and boundaries. I will sometimes make mistakes but I keep on trying!!!
